*APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Queen of Bronze Mining Co. (by Roy H. Clarke) of Takilma, County of Josephine, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation July, 1929. Spokane, Washington

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Waldo Creek, a tributary of Illinois River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 1.0 cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Mining

4. The point of diversion is located ft. and ft. from the corner of S. 22° W. 1910' from NE cor. Sec. 35

being within the SE 1/4 of Sec. 35, Tp. 40 S, R. 8 W, W. M., in the county of Josephine

5. The Ditch to be 1/4 mile in length, terminating in the NE 1/4 of Sec. 35, Tp. 40 S, R. 8 W, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is No name

PERMIT

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Waldo Creek

The use to which this water is to be applied is Mining

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is November 3, 1929

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 26, 1930 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1931

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1932
