CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That JOHN T. ROBERTSON

of Halfway, State of Oregon, has a right to the use of the waters of Pine Creek for Tract No. 1, and Clear Creek, tributary of Pine Creek, for Tract No. 2; for the purpose of Irrigation of 35.0 acres and domestic and stock use for Tract No. 1, and Irrigation of 70.0 acres, domestic and stock use for Tract No. 2; and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 11, at page 235; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1884 for Tract No. 1, and 1886 for Tract No. 2;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-fortieth of a cubic foot per second per acre, measured at the point of diversion, and a total limitation of one acre-foot per acre during July, one acre-foot per acre during August, and one-half acre-foot per acre during September, of each year.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

TRACT No. 1
35.0 acres in SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$,
Section 30,
Township 7 South, Range 46 East, W.M.

TRACT No. 2
35.0 acres in SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$,
35.0 acres in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$,
Section 30,
Township 7 South, Range 46 East, W.M.

AND said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said Decree.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
