, State of , has made proof Selma of Oregon to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Clear Creek a tributary of Illinois River for the purpose of Irrigation of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters under Permit No. 10869 has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from April 27, 1933 for 0.19 second-foot and June 8, 1933 for 0.11 second-foot; that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.3 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SELSML of Section 2, Township 38 South, Range 8 West, N. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited toone-fiftleth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated throughout the irrigation season from April 1, to November 1 of each year,
