CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That ETHEL HITCHCOCK

of Sisters, State of Oregon, has a right to the use of
the waters of Squaw Creek, tributary of Deschutes River
for the purpose of irrigation and domestic for 30 acres and irrigation for 9.88 acres;

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Crook County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 1, at pages 120 & 471; that the priority
of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1885;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.80 cubic foot per
second.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant
(or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

39.88 acres in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 4,
T. 15 S., R. 10 E., W. M.

NOTE: This certificate and certificates recorded at Pages 12305 and

sede certificate of water right issued to P. B. Davis and F. M. Baldwin and
recorded in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Volume 1, Page 271, and
certificate of water right issued to P. B. Davis and T. M. Baldwin and recorded
in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Volume 2, Page 987, and to confirm
a change in place of use of water approved by an order of the State Engineer
dated November 16, 1938, pursuant to Section 47-712, Oregon Code 1935 Supplement.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place
of use herein described.
