## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That W. G. COLEMAN

of 302 Baker Building,  
Walla Walla, State of Washington

has a right to the use of

the waters of South Fork Walla Walla River

for the purpose of Irrigation, Domestic and Stock

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 12, at page 9; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1891;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one and one-half miner's inches per acre measured at the point of diversion.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

1.0 acre in SE  $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 9,1.5 acres in SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 10,

T. 4 N., R. 37 E. W. M., being within the following

described tract: Beginning at a point in the fence line between the Merchant Redden land and Roberts Ranch, at an angle in fence about 5 ft. north of the north bank of the Walla Walla River and where fence post is anchored by rock crib about 4 ft. high, which point is 141 ft. north of and 44.3 ft. east from the  $\frac{1}{4}$ -sec. corner on the east line of Sec. 9, T. 4 N., R. 37 E. W. M.; thence in a northerly direction  $4^{\circ} 53'$  west (along said fence line) about 500 ft. to County road; thence easterly along the southerly line of said road about 525 ft.; thence in a southerly direction about 50 ft. to the Concrete Wall Fence bounding the Lee W. Roberts yard on the west; thence running in the same direction southerly along said Concrete Wall a distance of 145 ft.; thence at an angle southwesterly about 39 ft. to the NW cor. of a Rock Wall shed; thence along the westerly line of said Rock Wall shed a distance of 18 ft.; thence at right angles easterly about 18 ft. through the center of said shed to the east line thereof; thence at right angles southerly along the east side of said Rock Wall shed a distance of 18 ft.; thence in a southeasterly direction a distance of about 68 ft. to the Community Spring; thence running about 23 ft. northeasterly from said Community Spring to a point (marked by a large cottonwood tree); thence easterly about 70 ft. to the NW cor. of the D.J. Kirk camp site; thence in a southerly direction along the west line of said Kirk tract a distance of about 235 ft. to the right of way of the Pacific Power & Light Co. for a flume; thence westerly along said flume right of way a distance of about 320 ft. to a point which is S.  $16^{\circ} 26'$  W. and 78 ft. distant from the point of beginning; thence N.  $16^{\circ} 26'$  E. 78 ft. to the point of beginning, containing about 5 acres.

AND said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decrees.  
The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
