and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 12 , at page 9 ; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1875;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one and one-half miner's inches per acre measured at the point of diversion.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

> 11.6 acres in SWANWA 5.3 acres in NW SW Section 14,

T. 6 N., R. 35 E. W. M., being within the following described tract: Commencing at the northeast corner of the W_2^{\downarrow} of Lot 2 of the NW4 of Sec. 14, T. 6 N., R. 35 E. W. M., and running thence westerly on the line between the states of Oregon and Washington a distance of 39 rods; thence south 70 rods; thence east 39 rods; thence north 70 rods to the place of beginning, containing 17 acres more or less, all east of Willamette Meridian in Umatilla County, Oregon.

(NOTE: This right is restricted to the use of the waters naturally flowing in the East Prong of the Little Walla Walla Spring Branch.)

AND said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
