CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That ANNA KELLY

of R. #1, Milton, State of Oregon, has a right to the use of
the waters of Walla Walla River
for the purpose of Irrigation

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order
Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 12, at page 9; that the priority
of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1862;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one and one-half
miner's inches per acre measured at the point of diversion.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or,
if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

6.3 acres in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 20,

T. 5 N., R. 36 E. W. M., being within the follow-
ing described tract: Beginning at a point 2 rods south of the northwest corner
of Sec. 20, T. 5 N., R. 36 E. W. M., running thence south 78 rods; thence east
30.75 rods; thence north 178 ft. to the south bank of the Walla Walla River;
thence northwesterly along said south bank of said river 222 ft.; thence north
1022 ft.; thence west 302.5 ft. to the place of beginning, containing 10 acres,
more or less. Excepting all that portion of the above described land sold to the
City of Milton, which is south of the said Walla Walla River.

AND said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations
contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use
herein described.
