and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 12, at page 9; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1878;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one and one-half miner's inches per acre measured at the point of diversion.

A description of the lands irrigued under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where with water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

2.83 acres in SELSEL Section 12

T. 5 N., R. 35 E. W. M., being within the following described tract: Beginning at a point on Russell St. at the southeast corner of Lot A, Block 11, of Nichols Addition to Milton, Umatilla County, Oregon, running thence west to the east line of Cherry St.; thence southerly along the east line of Cherry St. 429.6 ft. more or less to the northerly line of Concord Ave.; thence northeasterly along the northerly line of said Concord Ave. 272 ft. more or less to the west line of Russell St. to the place of beginning.

AND said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
