CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, that SARAH WALDEN

of R. #1, Milton

, State of Oregon

, has a right to the use of

the waters of Spring rising on land of W. C. Hopson

for the purpose of Supplemental Irrigation, and domestic and stock,

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 12, at page 9; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1862;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one and one-half miner's inches per acre measured at the point of diversion.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

4.5 acres in NaiNWa Section 20

T. 5 N., R. 36 E. W. M., being within the following described tract: Commencing 30.75 rods east and 2 rods south of the northwest corner of Sec. 20, T. 5 N., R. 36 E. W. M., running thence south 78 rods; thence east 12.25 rods; thence east 12.25 rods; thence north 78 rods; thence west 12.25 rods to beginning, containing 6 acres.

(NOTE: The amount of water diverted from the Spring above described, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall not exceed one and one-half miner's inches per acre measured at the point of diversion.)

AND said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
