that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.30 cubic foot per second, being 0.03 c.f.s. for supplemental irrigation and 0.27 c.f.s. for stock

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW SEL, Section 29, Township 7 South, Range 39 East, N. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-twentieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

> Stock Use in the St NE Stock Use in the NE NE Section 29 Stock and 0.1 acre in SW4 NK4 Stock Use in the NET NWA Stock and 0.4 acre in NW4 NW4 Stock Use in the SEA NWA Section 28 Tp. 7 S., R. 39 E., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
