# CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That C. B. DENNING

of Cove, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Two Springs a tributary of Mill Creek for the purpose of Irrigation under Permit No. 12659 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 20, 1937

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.05 cubic foot per second, being 0.025 cubic foot per second from each spring,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 15, Township 3 South, Range 40 East, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated throughout the irrigation season, and shall be still further limited to a diversion at the stream of 0.05 cubic foot per second,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

6 acres in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  
Section 15,  
T. 3 S., R. 40 E., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
