for the purpose of the irrigation of 1952 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Reserve of the State of Oregon, in Volume 4, at page 252; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from the year 1867 for the irrigation of 80 acres, 1897 for 80 acres, and 1904 for 35½ acres.

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purpose aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purpose, and shall not exceed a rate of flow of 5.00 sec. ft. from March 1st to July 1st amd 2.45 sec. ft. from July 1st to October 1st of each year; the total quantity diverted during each irrigation season not to exceed 488.8 acre feet.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: 160 acres in SE4; Section Twenty-one (21); 16 acres in NE4 of SW4; 162 acres in SW4 of SW4; 3 acres in SE4 of SW4; Section Twenty-two (22), Township Six (6) South, Range Thirty-nine (39) East of Willamette Meridian, in Union County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
