and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Marion County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 14, , at page 357 '; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1904.

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 2.0 gallons per minute from each of two springs, and 2.0 gallons per minute from an unnamed stream, trib. to Mill Creek.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Within the following described tract:

Beginning at a point in the center of the county road 9.74 chains east of the southwest corner of the Charles Benson D.L.C. in Sec. 1, T. 9 S., R. 1 W., W.M., in Marion County, Oregon; running thence west along the center of the county road 9.74 chains to the southwest corner of said D.L.C.; thence south 83° west 3.52 chains; thence south 46.25 chains to the center of the county road; thence north 862° east 12.90 chains; thence north 45' east 45.54 chains to the place of beginning and containing 60 acres more or less.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
