CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For Rights which have been confirmed by the Courts)

This is to Certify, That C. E. JACOBSON of North Powder State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of North Powder River, a tributary of Powder River

for the purpose of the irrigation of 374.5 acres and stock use

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 2, at page 252; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from the year 1890 for the irrigation of 140 acres, and from 1893 for 234 1/2 acres.

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed a rate of flow of 9.37 sec. ft. from March 1st to July 1st and 4.68 sec. ft. from July 1st to October 1st of each year; the total quantity diverted during each irrigation season not to exceed 937 acre feet

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: 40 acres in SW 1/4 of NE 1/4; 80 acres in S 1/2 of NW 1/4; 37 acres in NE 1/4 of SW 1/4; 40 acres in NW 1/4 of SW 1/4; 39 acres in SW 1/4 of SW 1/4; 40 acres in SE 1/4 of SW 1/4; 80 acres in W 1/2 of SE 1/4; 12 acres in NE 1/4 of SE 1/4; 6 1/2 acres in SE 1/4 of SE 1/4 Section Twenty-six (26), Township Six (6) South, Range Thirty-nine (39) East of Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
