CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That Martha E. Bowes

of Lyons, , State of Oregon , has a right to the use of
the waters of Mad Creek
for the purpose of Stock

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Marion County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 14 , at page 354 ; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed ~~is~~ is subject to the provisions of Paragraph 165 of said decree;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall ~~not~~ be subject to the provisions of Paragraph 165 of said decree;

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

containing 160 acres, more or less, all lying and being situate in Linn County, Oregon. Also the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 35, Tp. 9 S., R. 3 E., W. M., saving and excepting therefrom 2 acres sold to Linn County, Oregon, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the north boundary line of said Sec. 35, said point being 583 feet west of the northeast corner of said Sec. 35; thence running west along said section line 525 feet; thence south 114 feet; thence south 78° 35' east 535 feet; thence north 220 feet to the point of beginning, the lands being and containing 38 acres, more or less, in Linn County, Oregon

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
