## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Marion County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 14, at page 354; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1893; for domestic, irrigation and stock; and shall be subject to the provisions of Paragraph 165 of said decree for stock use with no diversions;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall motococci be subject to the provisions of Paragraph 165 of said decree;

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Place of use for domestic, irrigation and stock:

2.0 acres in NW SE4 Sec. 20, Tp. 9 S., R. 2 E., W. M.

Place of use for stock: (no diversions)

Sa NE2, Sec. 20,

and commencing at the center of said Sec. 20 and running thence south to the north line of the railroad through said section; thence easterly along the north line of said railroad to the east line of the  $W_2^1$  SE $_2^1$ , said Sec. 20; thence north to the center line of said Sec. 20; thence west 20 chains to the place of beginning, containing about 135 acres, all situate in said Sec. 20, Tp. 9 S., R. 2 E., W. M., Linn County, Oregon.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
