CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That CHAS. T. MONTGOMERY

of Route 4, Box 77, Medford, State of Oregon has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Unnamed Spring a tributary of Bear Creek Watershed, tributary of Rogue River for the purpose of Domestic, including the irrigation of a garden not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ acre in area. under Permit No. 16139 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from January 8, 1945

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 21, Township 37 South, Range 1 West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to $\frac{1}{2}$ of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Section 21
T. 37 S., R. 1 W., W.M.

Land on which water is to be used is a part of the property more explicitly described by appropriator as follows: Lot One in Block One of Orchard tracts, Pierce Sub-division, filed in County Clerk's office, Jackson County.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
