CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That STELLA K. JOHNSON

of O'Brien, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of a spring a tributary of Elk Creek, a tributary of W. Fk. Illinois River for the purpose of domestic supplies and auto court under Permit No. 16823 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from February 28, 1946

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.07 cubic foot per second,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 14, Township 41 South, Range 9 West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to _____ of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$,
Section 14,
T. 41 S., R. 9 W., W.M.

Land on which water is to be used is a part of the property more explicitly described by appropriator as follows:

Beginning at a point where the West side of the Redwood Highway intersects the South boundary line of the Northwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 14, Township 41 South, Range 9 West, of the Willamette Meridian in Josephine County, Oregon and run thence West along said boundary line a distance of about 240 feet to the break of a swale, thence along the break of said swale to a fir tree marked with an "X"; thence North to center of Dwight Creek; thence down the center of Dwight Creek to the Redwood Highway; thence Southerly along the boundary line of the Redwood Highway to the place of beginning, containing 5 acres more or less and taking in all of the flat land between the swale and the Highway.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
