CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That LEE W. KALLENBACH

of Route 3, Hillsboro Oregon State of , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of McKay Creek for the purpose of

a tributery of Tualatin River

irrigation under Permit No. 15296 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from June 10, 1942

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.22 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

The point of diversion is located in the SWA SEA, Section 31, Township 2 North, Range 2 West,

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to conceightioth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre i rigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 22 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

13.1 acres in NW4 NE4, as projected on Anderson Smith D.L.C. 64 1.5 acres in SWA NEA, as projected on Anderson Smith D.L.C. 64 Section 6

T. 1 N., R. 2 W., W. M. 3.0 acres in SW4 SE4, as projected on Anderson Smith D.L.C. 38 Section 31 T. 2 N., R. 2 W., W. M.

Land on which water is to be used is a part of that more explicitly described by appropriator as follows:

The following described three tracts of land being parts of the Anderson Smith D.L.C. #64 in T. 1, N R 2 W. and #38 in T. 2 N.R.2 W. Willamette Meridian, as follows: Beginning at the Northeast corner of the Paul Paulson's Land, an iron pipe bearing N. 2° W. 33.52 chains and S. 88° W. 17.48 chains from the Southeast corner of said claim and from thence running N. 1° 40° W. 8.86 chains to an iron corner; thence S. 88° W. 7.00 chains to an iron corner on the east line of George Bantz' land; thence on said line S. 1° 54' W. 7.53 chains to a post, the southeast corner of said Bantz land, from which an oak tree bears N. 22° W. 0.225 chains; thence along the north line of Paulson's land S. 89° E. 7.53 chains to the place of beginning, containing 6.29

Also beginning at an iron corner bearing N. 2° W. 42.38 chains and S. 88° W. 17.43 chains from the Southeast corner of said claim and running S. 88° W. 7.00 chains to an iron corner on the east line of George Bantz' land; thence along said line N. 1° 54;
