CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That Robert Casey

of Ashland, State of Oregon, has a right to the use of

the waters of Ashland Creek, a tributary of Bear Creek

for the purpose of irrigation of 13.5 acres in Tract No. 1, and irrigation of 4 acres and Stock in Tract No. 2

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of

the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 4, at page 1; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1864 for Tract No. 1, and 1858 for Tract No. 2;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.16 cubic foot per second for Tract No. 1, and 0.08 cubic foot per second for Tract No. 2.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

Tract No. 1 - Beginning 16.5 ft. E. and 162 ft. N. of NW cor. D. L. C. 40, T. 39 S., R. 1 E., W. M., thence E. 537.6 ft.; S. 162 ft.; E. 705.18 ft.; N. 613.8 ft.; W. 1242.78 ft.; S. 451.8 ft. to beg., being a part of fractional Sec. 5, and fractional NW 1/4 of Section 4, said Township and Range, Jackson County, Oregon.

Tract No. 2 - 4 acres in fractional NE 1/4 of Section 5, T. 39 S., R. 1 E., W. M., being part of the Frank Smith or B. F. Meyer place, all in Jackson County, Oregon.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
