CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That CROWN ZELLERBACH CORPORATION
1100 Public Service Building,
of Portland, State of Oregon, has made proof
to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of
the North and South Forks of the East Fork Elbow Lake Creek
a tributary of _____ for the purpose of
domestic use
under Permit No. 16188 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters
has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby
confirmed dates from February 15, 1945.

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes
aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed
0.01225 cubic foot per second, being 0.006 cubic foot per second from the North
Fork and 0.00625 cubic foot per second from the South Fork,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.
The point of diversion is located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 33, Township 20 South, Range 12
West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other
right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to _____ of one cubic foot per second
per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is
appurtenant, is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described.
