**CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT**

**This Is to Certify,** That BENTON CO. FLAX GROWERS CO-OP.

of Route 3, Junction City, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Long Tom River, a tributary of Willamette River, for the purpose of retting and processing flax, under Permit No. 15254 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from April 22, 1942

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.155 cubic foot per second,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , as projected on Aaron Richardson D.L.C. No. 44, Section 16, Township 14 South, Range 5 West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to \_\_\_\_\_ of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Retting and processing flax in:

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
