for the purpose of the irrigation of ten acres of land, domestic and stock use;

oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Review of the State of the State of Oregon, in Volume 3, at page 322; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from the year 1893 for 4 acres and from 1894 for 2 acres from Middle Branch of Mud Creek and Behnke Spring Branch and from 1875 for 4 acres from Behnke Spring;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed a rate of flow of 0.13 cubic foot per second or its equivalent in case of rotation. The use for irrigation purposes shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: Ten acres in Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-one (21). Township Six (6) North, Hange Thirty-five (35) East of Willamette Meridian, in Umatilla County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
