CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That L. F. ELAM

of c/o Elam Lumber Co., Farmersville, State of California, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Neil Creek a tributary of Bear Creek, a tributary of Rogue River, for the purpose of log pond and fire protection under Permit No. 17145 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from July 11, 1946

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 12, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to - - - - - of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 12
Township 39 South, Range 1 East, W. M.

Land on which water is to be used is a part of that more explicitly described by applicant as follows: Commencing at the junction of the Dead Indian road and the Lithia Springs road and running thence easterly along the said Lithia Springs road 830 feet to an iron stake; thence southerly and parallel with said Dead Indian road to Neal Creek; thence westerly along the northerly bank of said Neal Creek to the east line of the Dead Indian road; thence along the road to the point of beginning. All in section 12, T. 39 S, R. 1 E. W.M. in Jackson County.

The above parcel of land is part of the lands owned by John S. Owens as evidenced by Jackson Co. Deed Records in Vol. 258 on page 495. Which show said Owens owns the entire N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 12.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
