CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That R. M. CORNWELL

of Route 2, Box 148, Beaverton, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of an unnamed stream a tributary of Cedar Mill Creek, a tributary of Beaverton Creek, for the purpose of irrigation under Permit No. 18977 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from September 12, 1949

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.006 cubic foot per second,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, as projected on Lawrence Hall D.L.C. No. 43, Section 4, Township 1 South, Range 1 West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

1/2 acre in NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, as projected on Lawrence Hall D.L.C. No. 43
Section 4

Township 1 South, Range 1 West, W. M.

Land on which water is to be used is a part of that more explicitly described by applicant as follows:

A tract of land situated in Sec. 4, T. 1 S., R. 1 W., W.M., in Washington County, State of Oregon, and more particularly described as follows: Beg. at a point in county road No. 215 from which the most northeasterly re-entrant corner of the W. boundary line of the Lawrence Hall and wife D.L.C. No. 43, bears N. 43° 08' W. a distance of 688.38 ft. N. 64° 24' E. a distance of 30.47 feet to an iron pipe; thence S. 35° 43' E. a distance of 237.28 feet to an iron pipe; thence N. 65° 14' east a distance of 1045.93 feet to an iron pipe; thence S. 24° 46' E. a distance of 198.56 ft. to a point; thence N. 66° 07' E. a distance of 108.785 feet and the true place of beginning of the tract to be described; thence continuing N. 66° 07' east a distance of 108.785 feet to the SE cor. of the Houston tract described in Deed Book 263, page 715, Deed Records of Washington Co., Ore., thence N. 24° 46' W. a distance of 201.91 feet to an iron pipe; thence S. 65° 14' W. a distance of 108.775 feet; thence southeasterly to the place of beginning.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
