of Route 2, Killanina , State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of , has made proof Willamina Creek a tributary of for the purpose of Yamhill River irrigation under Permit No. of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters 17126 has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from July 2, 1946 that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.21 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the WE 1NW1, Section 12, Township 5 South, Range 7 West. W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-cightieth of one cubic foot per second per acreor its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 22 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

> 4.2 acres in the SELSWA Section 1 .12.5 acres in the NEINW! Section 12 Township 5 South, Range 7 West, W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
