CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For Rights which have been confirmed by the Court)

This is to Certify, That GEORGE McDONALD of Klamath Falls State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of Lost River, a tributary of Tule Lake

for the purpose of the irrigation of 239 acres of land, domestic and stock use

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Klamath County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 4, at page 94; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from 1872 for Tract No. 1 and 1874 for Tract No. 2

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 597.5 acre feet during any irrigation season, and a quantity for domestic and stock purposes outside of the irrigation season at the rate of one-half second foot for each 1000 head of stock; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: Tract No. 1: 17 acres in the SE 1/4 SW 1/4, 35 acres in the NW 1/4 SE 1/4, 36 acres in the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 and 40 acres in the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 1, T 41 S. R. 13 E. W. M., in Klamath County, Oregon.

Tract No. 2: 40 acres in the NE 1/4 NE 1/4, 32 acres in the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 and 2 acres in the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 12, T 41 S. R. 13 E. W. M., and 37 acres in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 7, T 41 S. R. 14 E. W. M., in Klamath County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
