CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That PAUL B. HULT LUMBER COMPANY
Paul B. Hult, President
of Dillard, State of Oregon, has made proof
to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of
South Umpqua River & reservoir to be constructed under Application No. R-29830,
Permit No. 1835 a tributary of Umpqua River for the purpose of
maintenance of log ponds
under Permit No. 24062 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters
has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby
confirmed dates from September 8, 1954

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes
aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed
0.2 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.
The point of diversion is located in the #1 - SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, #2 - NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 29, Township
28 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other
right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to - - - - - of one cubic foot per second
per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is
appurtenant, is as follows:

- No. 1 - SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 29
 - No. 1 - NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 32
 - No. 2 - NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 29
- Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described.
