CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That ROBERT HYSLOP

of Deep Creek, State of Washington, has a right to the use of
the waters of Squaw Creek, a tributary of Deschutes River
for the purpose of irrigation and domestic use

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Crook County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of
the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 1, at page 120; that the priority of the right thereby
confirmed dates from 1880;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1.62 cubic feet per
second.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant
(or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

3.0 acres in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
18.0 acres in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
30.0 acres in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$

NOTE: This certificate, together with certificate recorded at Page 24028, Volume
17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is issued to confirm a change in
place of use of water approved by an Order of the State Engineer entered November
8, 1955, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530, and supersedes
certificate of water right heretofore issued to Robert Hyslop and recorded at
Page 279, Volume 1, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described.
