## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That PETER SASS

of Richland

, State of Oregon

, has a right to the use of

the waters of Fagle Creek, a tributary of Powder River

for the purpose of irrigation of 102 acres of land

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 6, at page 291; that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1880:

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acres and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant (or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

10 acres in the Nwd Swd Section 25,
40 acres in the SEd NEd 32 acres in the NEd SEd 20 acres in the SEd SEd Section 26,
Township 9 South, Range 45 Fast, W. M.

NOTE: This certificate is issued to confirm a change in place of use and point of diversion of water approved by an Order of the State Engineer entered April 1, 1958, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530, and supersedes certificate of water right heretofore issued to Peter Sass and recorded at Page 4719, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
