CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For Rights which have been confirmed by the Courts)

This is to Certify, That ELWOOD STRAUGHAN

of Fendleton State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of Birch Creek, a tributary of the Umatilla River,

for the purpose of the irrigation of 74 acres of land, domestic and stock use,

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume-3 at page 127 ; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from 1876

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.94 cubic feet per second, subject to the provisions of paragraph 33 of said decree and all other conditions and limitations contained in said decrees.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: 12 1/2 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southeast quarter of Section Twenty-nine; 35 acres in the Northeast quarter of Northeast quarter 2 1/2 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northeast quarter and 4 1/2 acres in the Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Thirty-two; 6 1/2 acres in the Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter and 13 acres in the Southwest quarter of Northwest quarter of Section Thirty-three, Township Two North, Range Thirty-two East of Willamette Meridian, in Umatilla County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
