CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For Rights which have been confirmed by the Courts)

This is to Certify, That THOS. D. WAUGH

of Pilot Rock State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of West Birch Creek a tributary of the Umatilla River,

for the purpose of the irrigation of 58 acres of land, domestic and stock use,

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 3, at page 127; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from 1880 for 20 acres, 1892 for 20 acres and 1909 for 18 acres,

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purpose and shall not exceed 0.72 cubic feet per second, subject to the provisions of paragraph 33 of said decree and all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: 16 acres in the Southwest quarter of Northeast quarter; 3 acres in the Northeast quarter of Southwest quarter; 21 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southwest quarter; 10 acres in the Northwest quarter of Southeast quarter, and 8 acres in the Southwest quarter of Southeast quarter of Section Nineteen, Township One South, Range Thirty-two East of Willamette Meridian, in Umatilla County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
