CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For Rights which have been confirmed by the Courts)

This is to Certify, That WA-WA-NE, by Wm. Caldwell, of Pendleton State of Oregon has a right to the use of the waters of Umatilla River, a tributary of the Columbia River,

for the purpose of the irrigation of 57 ac. land, domestic and stock use,

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volume 3 at page 127; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 23, 1895

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purpose, and shall not exceed 0.71 cubic feet per second, subject to the provisions of paragraph 33 of said decree and all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: 21 acres in the Southwest quarter of Southwest quarter of Section One; 7 acres in the Northeast quarter of Southeast quarter and 29 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southeast quarter of Section Two, Township Two North, Range Thirty-three East of Willamette Meridian, in Umatilla County, Oregon.

NOTE: This right when used by an Indian is paramount to all other rights; when used by any other person is regulated by priority date.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
