and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, STATE WATER BOARD of the State of Oregon, in Volumext, at in the Order Record of the H 250 ; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from 1885; page

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1.82 cubic feet per second, and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: 7.5 acres in the Northeast quarter of Southeast quarter; 21 acres in the Northwest quarter of Southeast quarter; 11 acres in the Southwest quarter of Southeast quarter and 33 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southeast quarter of Section Twenty-one, and 18.5 acres in the Northeast quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-eight, Township One North, Range Twenty-seven East of Willamette Meridian, in Morrow County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
