## **CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT**

This Is to Certify, That ARTHUR M. & DOROTHY BIBB

of Acre Ranch, Mt. Hood , State of Oregon , has made proof to the stitisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of unusumed stream

a tributary of Yellow Jacket Creek (or Baldwin Creek) irrigation of 59.8 acres

for the purpose of

under Permit No. 25083 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from July 26, 1957

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.33 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the  $SE_{\frac{1}{4}}$   $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}$  Section 4, T. 1 S., R. 10 E., W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed hears feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

0.5 acre SEA NWA
38.1 acres NEA SWA
20.0 acres NWA SWA
1.2 acres NWA SEA

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
