## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For Rights which have been confirmed by the Courts)

This is to Certify, That

for the purpose of the irrigation of  $2\frac{1}{4}$  acres of land and stock use

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for

Wallowa

County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order

Record of the State Water Board of the State of Oregon, in Volume 5, at page 148, that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from 1893

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes

aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 12 acre feet per acre during any period of 30 days prior to July 31st of each year, and thereafter not to exceed 1 acre foot per acre during the entire remainder of the irrigation season; and said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water hereby con-

firmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use,

is as follows: 1 acre in Lot 46, Residence Addition to the City of Wallowa, Oregon  $1\frac{1}{4}$  acres in the  $SW_{4}^{1}NW_{4}^{1}$  of Section 14, Township 1 North, Range 42 East of Willamette Meridian, in Wallowa County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
