CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That LLOYD CORPORATION, LTD.

of 720 N.E. 12th Avenue, Portland, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Sheraton Hotel Well

a tributary of Willamette River (Columbia River) for the purpose of industrial - heat, pump and air conditioning

under Permit No. G-1144 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from December 3, 1958

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 2.0 cubic feet per second. The water used under this permit together with water used under Permit No. G-636 shall not exceed 2.0 cubic feet per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ as projected within Sullivan DIC 71, Section 35, T. 1 N., R. 1 E., W. M., well is 253.05 ft. N. and 90.51 ft. E. from the S.W. corner, Block 112 Holladay's Addition.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to - - - - - of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
