CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That **ALSEA LUMBER COMPANY, INC.**

of **§ Ross J. Bowles, 729 Crest Drive, Eugene**, State of **Oregon**, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of an unnamed stream and South Umpqua River

a tributary of **Umpqua River** for the purpose of maintenance of log pond constructed under App. No. R-31202, Permit No. R-1958

under Permit No. **24575** of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from **November 9, 1956**

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed **0.10 cubic foot per second**, being **0.05 c.f.s.** from unnamed stream and **0.05 c.f.s.** from South Umpqua River

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the **#1 - NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, #2 - NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$** , as projected within Phipps DIC No. 37, Sec. 3, T. 29 S., R. 6 W., W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to - - - - - of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

as projected within Phipps DIC No. 37
Section 3
T. 29 S., R. 6 W., W.M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
