CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That D. W. GILL

of P. O. Box 725, Canyonville, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of South Umpqua River

a tributary of Umpqua River for the purpose of irrigation

under Permit No. 25770 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from July 28, 1958;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ as projected within Yakum DIC 43, Section 19, T. 30 S., R. 5 W., W.M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that the right to the use of water is limited to the period when the flow of water in the South Umpqua River is 60.0 c.f.s. or more at its mouth,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

1.5 acres NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$
as projected within Yakum DIC 43
Section 19
T. 30 S., R. 5 W., W.M.

Land on which water is to be used is part of that described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pipe on the right bank of Umpqua River from which a 10 inch white oak tree bears N. 30° E. 69.2 feet, said beginning point being S. 38° 39' E., 618.6 ft. from a steel rod previously set by a deputy County Surveyor for the center of said Section 19, said steel rod being S. 89° 50' W., 2786.0 ft. from the E $\frac{1}{2}$ section corner of said Sec. 19; thence running from said beginning point N. 45° 42' E., 166.0 ft. to an 18 inch white oak tree; thence N. 63° 15' E., 289.6 ft. to an iron pipe; thence S. 63° 26' E., 240.0 ft. to an iron pipe; thence S. 63° 15' W., 315.0 ft. to a point; thence S. 45° 42' W., 200.0 ft. to the center of said river; thence N. 61° 16' W., 10.0 ft., N. 74° 16' W., 100.0 ft. and N. 52° 06' W., 126.0 ft. along center of said river to a point; thence N. 45° 42' E., 50.0 ft. to the place of beginning.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
