or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW_4^1 SW_4^1 , Section 4, T. 8 S., R. 40 E., N. M. Well located 14 chains North and 18 chains East from SN corner, Section 4,

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the cmount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:
