CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That WILLIAM M. COLTON

of Medical Springs, State of Oregon, has a right to the use of
the waters of Big Creek, tributary of Powder River
for the purpose of irrigation of 90.5 acres

and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Baker County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of
the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 6, at page 291; that the priority of the right thereby
confirmed dates from 1885 for 33 acres, 1873 for 40.5 acres, 1894 for 12 acres,
and 1871 for 5 acres

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-fortieth of one
cubic foot per second per acre.

A description of the lands irrigated under such right, and to which the water is appurtenant
(or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use), is as follows:

30.0 acres SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
35.5 acres SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
20.0 acres NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 11
T. 7 S., R. 41 E., W. M.
5.0 acres NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$
Section 26
T. 6 S., R. 41 E., W. M.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in place of use and point of
diversion approved by an order of the State Engineer entered October 31, 1962,
and supersedes certificate of water right heretofore issued to Martha S. Harsin
and recorded at page 4200, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of
use herein described.
