CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That **WILLIAM M. and MARY HOUSLEY,**

of **Central Point** , State of **Oregon** , has a right
to the use of the waters of **Rogue River**

a tributary of **Pacific Ocean** for the purpose of
domestic, stock and irrigation of 4.5 acres
and that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
Jackson County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of
the **STATE ENGINEER**, in Volume **16** , at page **523** ; that the priority of the right thereby
confirmed dates from **September 22, 1888;**

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an
amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed **0.06 cubic foot per**
second.

The point of diversion is located in the **Lot 7 (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$) Section 6, T. 36 S., R. 1 W., W.M.**

A description of the place of use under the right, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as
follows:

**4.5 acres in that part of Lot 8 (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$)
Section 11,
T. 36 S., R. 2 W., W.M.
described as follows:**

Beginning at a point 285.2 feet East of NW corner of D.L.C. 42 in Section 11,
T. 36 S., R. 2 W., W.M.; running thence East along the North line of said D.L.C. 42,
668.5 feet; thence North 325.8 feet; thence West 668.5 feet; thence South 325.8 feet
to the point of beginning, excepting an easement for road purposes for 15 feet
along the East side of said premises.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place
of use herein described.
