CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That WILLIAM ARNOLD SUNDERMEIER

of Route 1, Box 123-B-1, Gaston, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of an unnamed spring

a tributary of Johnson Creek for the purpose of domestic use of one family, including irrigation of not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ acre lawn and garden under Permit No. 28519 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from December 13, 1962

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ as projected within Dickson DIC 45, Section 23, T. 1 S., R. 4 W., W. M. Spring located 876 feet East and 1712 feet North from Re-entrant corner DIC 45. The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to - - - - - of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$
as projected within J. Dickson DIC 45
Section 23
T. 1 S., R. 4 W., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
