## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

## This Is to Certify, That HAROLD NELSON

of P. O. Box 706, Corvallis , State of Cregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Ashley Creek

a tributary of Bowers Slough (Willamette River) irrigation of 2.0 acres

for the purpose of

under Permit No. 28974 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from July 31, 1963

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 9.025 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW2 NE2 as projected within J. Robinson DLC 144, Section 15, T. 11 S., R. 5 W., W. M. Diversion point located 875 feet East and 590 feet South from the NW Corner DLC 144.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2½ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

2.0 acres SW NE NE as projected within J. Robinson DLC lul Section 15 T. 11 S., R. 5 W., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
