CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That ERNEST A. FINCH and CHARLES L. CREASY, JR.

of 1533 Court Street N.E., Salem, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Little Fork North Santiam River

a tributary of North Santiam River for the purpose of domestic use of two families

under Permit No. 27569 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from August 31, 1961

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NE 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 17, T. 9 S., R. 2 E., W. M. Diversion point located 978 feet South and 2319 feet East from the NW corner of Section 17.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to - - - - - of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4
Section 17
T. 9 S., R. 2 E., W. M.

Land on which water is to be used is part of that described as follows:

Lots 13 and 15 of North Santiam Paradise Park as shown on page 42, Volume 17, Record of Town Plats in the office of the recorder for Marion County, Oregon.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
