that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 2.01 cubic feet per second

or its equivement in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NE4 SE4, Section 27, T. 8 S., R. 40 E., W. M. Diversion point located 1220 feet South and 2025 feet East from the NW Corner at the SE4 of Section 27

of the SE of Section 27.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ane-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year;

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
