a tributary of South Umpqua River for the purpose of

irrigation of 87.7 acres under Permit No. 29158 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from November 12, 1963

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1.09 cubic feet per second, being 0.25 c.f.s. from Livingston Creek and Reservoir and 0.84 c.f.s. from Deer Creek and Reservoir,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW_{k}^{1} , SE_{k}^{1} , as projected within Anderson DLC 46, Section 18; NE_{k}^{1} , NW_{k}^{1} , NW_{k}^{1} , NW_{k}^{1} , both as projected within Anderson DLC 47, Section 19, T. 27 S., R. 4 W., W. M. Diversion points located below:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed $2\frac{1}{2}$ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage under permit No. R-3861; provided further that the right to use of direct flow is limited to the period when the flow of the South Umpqua River is more than 60 c.f.s. at its mouth;

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
