a tributary of Willemette River irrigation of 49.8 acres

for the purpose of

under Permit No. 32436 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from March 16, 1967

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.62 subde foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NBL NBL, as projected within Butler DLC 68, Section 33, T. 9 S., R. 4 W., W. M. Diversion point located 5470 feet South and 750 feet East from NW Corner, Butler DLC 68.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2½ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year;

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

19.8 acres NW NW 6.6 acres SW NW NW both as projected within Butler DLC 68 Section 27

23.4 acres NE NE NE Section 28
T. 9 S., R. 4 W., W. M.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
