## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That

W. W. SHEREFITZ and ROGER S. WINTERS

of Box 304, Bandon , State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Spring Creek and Reservoir constructed under Permit No. R-2240

a tributary of Coquille River harvesting cranberries on 13.9 acres

for the purpose of

under Permit No. 31470 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from March 29. 1966

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second from Spring Creek and 3.0 acre feet stored water from Reservoir,

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW NEL, Section 20, T. 28 S., R. 14 W., W. M. Diversion point located 800 feet South and 520 feet East from NL Corner, Section 20.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
