## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

of Star Route, Azalea , State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Cow Creek

a tributary of South Umpqua River irrigation of 9.68 acres

appurtenant, is as follows:

for the purpose of

under Permit No. 30102 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from October 23, 1964

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.12 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the NW1 NE1, Section 33, T. 31 S., R. 4 W., W. M. Diversion point located 1370 feet North and 110 feet East from Center, Section

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-seventieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 32 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year;

and shall

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is

0.28 acre SW NE NE 14.8 acres NE 14.04 NW 14.6 acres SE 14.0 NW 15.5 N

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.
